A faculty member recently reminded me about the importance of storytelling. He reminded me that storytelling was as much for the listener as it is for the speaker. As the recently deceased poet and writer, N. Scott Momaday, once said,

"[Story] exists at the level of the human voice, and it's immediate. People who do not have writing take storytelling very seriously because they must. The story is always one generation from extinction. So you have to listen, and you have to remember what you hear."

And in his (probably) most known book, *House Made of Dawn* (1968), Momaday credits his love of the Kiowa oral tradition to the stories of his father and the inspiration to write from his mother. His stories are also his history, his family, his culture, and the landscapes that occupy them. What the faculty member reminded me is that in our storytelling, we are also authoring ourselves. The College of Liberal Arts is pleased to announce that the **CoLA Faculty Incentive Programs** are now active and accepting applications. New applications for incentive funds are due to Benjamin Bricker (<u>brickeb@siu.edu</u>) by Monday, March 4, 2024. (Click on titles for full descriptions for all requirements.) Each of the five programs has a specific target and focus, as described briefly below.

- The <u>Faculty Summer Research Incentive Program</u> is open to all Assistant and Full Professors. Two \$5,000 awards will be made under this program to support research and creative activities of faculty at the rank of Assistant Professor or Professor.
- The <u>Associate Professor Summer Research Incentive Program</u> is open to all Associate Professors. Two \$5,000 awards will be made under this program to support the research and creative activities of faculty at the rank of Associate Professor.
- The <u>Interdisciplinary Research/Teaching Incentive Program</u> will provide financial support for CoLA faculty to engage in interdisciplinary or collaborative research, teaching, or creative activity projects. Two \$3,000 awards will be made through this fund.
- The <u>Inclusive Excellence Incentive Program</u> provides financial support for faculty members engaging in teaching, research, or creative activity projects focused on inclusive excellence intended to honor the challenging task of further transforming our community into one that not only celebrates the mission but also creates a world-class liberal arts college building on a heritage of diversity, equity, and inclusion. Two \$3,000 awards will be made through this fund.
- The <u>Pedagogy Exploration Incentive Program</u> provides support for faculty members of any rank to promote innovative pedagogical offerings within new or existing courses, including but not limited to: new modes of content delivery, use of new or innovative technology, the use of new experiential learning opportunities for students, and the development of new interdisciplinary courses. Up to five awards of \$1,000 each will be made for use over the next fiscal year.

All funds will be disbursed in FY25, pending budgetary approval for FY25.




