## World Language Day

On October 4, the School of Languages and Linguistics hosted 850 students from a dozen schools across the region at the 47th annual World Languages Day. In addition to the School of Languages and Linguistics, offices across campus including the University Museum, Morris Library, the Center for International Education, Political Science, the Digital Xpressions Lab, and the E-Sports arena all held sessions relating to language acquisition and cultures from around the world.

Following the welcomes from organizer Brianna Janssen-Sanchez and Dean Joddy Murray, the high school students were released to attend their choices of more than 50 break-out sessions held during the morning. The students were able to participate in a broad variety of sessions such as a linguistics escape room, study abroad information, artifact identification, Ukraine, American Sign Language history and deaf culture, the influence of Dance Dance Revolution on American culture, and the cultural history of tacos. Students were able to get moving when Liz Taylor from





University Communications taught Zumba lessons and Julio Barrenzuela made his annual return to campus to teach them how to dance salsa.

the university's multi factor authentication (MFA) also known as DUO, options may appear. If they do, select one of the options to complete the login process. The annual ethics training will be listed under "My Courses", "Fall 2022" tab and is titled, "Ethics Act Training Program (2022)". **General call for proposals:** A topic of your choice that would be of interest to undergraduate majors from an array of academic disciplines.


Remuneration: faculty incentive, i.e., \$3200 in OTS, if taught in addition to regular teaching duties; or Department incentive, i.e., \$3200 to the faculty member's academic unit for release of faculty to teach the course.

Call for Themed cluster: You will join a cluster of Honors faculty whose classes coalesce around this year's theme: Cosmos and Culture. Faculty in the cluster will make one public presentation on their research-teaching in the semester and potentially participate in working groups, including graduate and undergraduates (by invitation) to explore the theme. The Honors program also tries to coordinate our distinguished speaker series with the theme. Honors teaching fellows teach their courses on load (with agreement from School Director and College Dean) and receive \$3200 in OTS.
