The Spring 2024 10th day numbers are all in, and CoLA performed admirably well:

- Enrollment is at a 5 year high. CoLA increased 2.6% from last spring and a whopping 9.6% from spring 2022;

- Fall-to-Spring retention is at 93.85%, compared to the SIU retention rate at 84.15%;
- In each retention category highlighted in the fall Retention Retreat (Pell students, 1st Gen students, Black Male students; overall minority students), CoLA outperformed SIU by an average of 12 points.

What this says about CoLA is that we're doing precisely what we need to do to recruit and retrain students. It also says to everyone who looks at our numbers that the faculty and staff in CoLA demonstrably care about our student success. I for one really appreciate all the effort you all are doing to make our recruitment and retention outstanding. New applications for incentive funds are due to Benjamin Bricker ([brickeb@siu.edu](mailto:brickeb@siu.edu)) by Monday, March 4, 2024. (Click on titles for full descriptions for all requirements.) Each of the five programs has a specific target and focus, as described briefly below.

- The [Faculty Summer Research Incentive Program](#) is open to all Assistant and Full Professors. Two \$5,000 awards will be made under this program to support research and creative activities of faculty at the rank of Assistant Professor or Professor.
- The [Associate Professor Summer Research Incentive Program](#) is open to all Associate Professors. Two \$5,000 awards will be made under this program to support the research and creative activities of faculty at the rank of Associate Professor.
- The [Interdisciplinary Research/Teaching Incentive Program](#) will provide financial support for CoLA faculty to engage in interdisciplinary or collaborative research, teaching, or creative activity projects. Two \$3,000 awards will be made through this fund.
- The [Inclusive Excellence Incentive Program](#) provides financial support for faculty members engaging in teaching, research, or creative activity projects focused on inclusive excellence intended to honor the challenging task of further transforming our community into one that not only celebrates the mission but also creates a world-class liberal arts college building on a heritage of diversity, equity, and inclusion. Two \$3,000 awards will be made through this fund.
- The [Pedagogy Exploration Incentive Program](#) provides support for faculty members of any rank to promote innovative pedagogical offerings within new or existing courses, including but not limited to: new modes of content delivery, use of new or innovative technology, the use of new experiential learning opportunities for students, and the development of new interdisciplinary courses. Up to five awards of \$1,000 each will be made for use over the next fiscal year.

All funds will be disbursed in FY25, pending budgetary approval for FY25.
