• Student enrollment for SP24 is up 2.6% higher than last year; from FA23 it's up 14%;

• The overall number of undergraduate majors is higher, as is our graduate enrollment;

- Student retention is also higher: for fall 23 to spring 24, SIU's retention was 84%—for CoLA it was 94%; for fall 23 to fall 24 SIU's retention was 64%; for CoLA it was 81% (see attached);
- It's no secret that we are in lean times this year with the budget; even so, we will hire 5, possibly 6, new TT faculty who will begin in August;
- The new Center for Virtual Expression
 officially had its grand opening; the graduate
 council has voted yes and the faculty senate
 also voted (unanimously) in the positive. We
 are now waiting for the Chancellor to sign the
 RME and send it to IBHE for approval;
- CoLA has signed MOUs with Poland and Lithuania that will increase our international partnerships and faculty/student exchanges;
- All new operating papers for the college and all of our units are expected to be finalized this semester;

Recent Accomplishments

Faculty

Pinckney Benedict, Interim Director of the Center for Virtual Expression (<u>CVeX</u>), is one of the winners of the SIU Foundation Research and Creative Activities Awards. His proposal titled "The Classroom of Tomorrow: Revolutionizing Learning with Augmented Reality" has been approved for funding.

Two CAI/Anthropology field school projects are featured in the latest edition of the Society for Historical Archaeology (SHA) newsletter. These include a project the CAI is conducting for the state of Illinois, part of which involves researching the Civil War-era Cairo Contraband Camp in Cairo Illinois. The short article (pages 31-32) features a photograph of **Dr. Mark Wagner**, Director, Center for Archaeological Instigations, with **George Hunt**, PhD student in History, on page 31 looking at maps of the contraband camp. The second article (pages 32-34) is on the SIUC field school investigations of the home site of an abolitionist missionary—Reverend James West—who was driven out of the region by a proslavery mob in 1861. His home site is now located on Forest Service land in Pope County. This past summer the Anthropology Department archaeology field school class participated in the initial investigation of this site along with Forest Service archaeologists and tribal youth from the United Ketoowah Cherokee band who were in southern Illinois as a part of a Forest Service outreach project.

The field school class is going to assist the Forest Service and UKB youth in further investigation of this site this summer.

Dr. K. Allison Hammer, Assistant Professor and WGSS Coordinator, has been selected for the SIU Inclusive Excellence Award.

SLL Preview Day

The School of Languages and Linguistics held their second annual Preview Day on Friday, March 22nd for prospective and admitted students. These students are high school and community college students who have expressed an interest in attending SIU and majoring in an SLL program.
