But I want to especially thank our Associate Dean for Budget, Personnel, and Research, Dr. Jennifer Smith. While the hiring season was just getting started, our hiring software changed (from HireTouch to NeoEd). This change was for the good, but it made Jennifer's job even more difficult as she transitioned from old processes and procedures, to interim fixes, to present-day reality of a new system. Some of the new faculty mentioned above were in the old system, some in an interim (manual) system, and some in the new system. Selectees of the 2024 CoLA Incentive Programs

The College of Liberal Arts is pleased to announce the following faculty proposals have been awarded funds through the CoLA Incentive Program.

Pedagogy Exploration Incentive (\$1,000):

- **Michael Olsen** (Linguistics). Dr. Olsen will be able to use PEI funds to continue an academic license with the Corpus of Contemporary American English (COCA) and related corpora. The license will permit multiple graduate students and faculty to use the COCA database for scholarly research in sociolinguistics and beyond. Dr. Olsen noted in his application that several graduate students in his linguistics seminar are successfully using COCA in and out of the classroom to investigate linguistic change in contemporary sociopolitical events. The funds can help future students and faculty continue similar research projects in multiple related courses.
- Josh Daniel (English). Dr. Daniel's funds will be used to help develop content for a new retention initiative in ENGL 101. The initiative is intended to help reduce the DFW rate in ENGL 101, a course that nearly all SIU students are required to take before graduating. As part of this effort, Dr. Daniel will work with the Center for Virtual Expression (CVeX) to provide students an optional toolkit of videos and assignments that can help illustrate SIUs support services and show students how those support services can be utilized.

• **Josh Houston** (Communication Studies). Josh will use his funds to help continue development of a PR Spin course. One of the most interesting innovations in the course is that Josh uses the word Spin in both of its forms: Students will learn how public relations professionals use persuasive language, which is often known as 'spin.' At the same time, the course will be located in the Rec Center's Cycle Studio, and students can do spin exercise while they participate in the course.

Interdisciplinary Research and Teaching Summer Incentive (\$3,000):

Randall Auxier (Communication Studies and Philosophy). Dr. Auxier's
proposal focuses on his work creating the Cassirer Center, a global
interdisciplinary center of learning, research, and cultural diplomacy
operating in part through a bilateral relationship between SIU and the
University of Wrocław in Poland. The funds will be used to help further
develop the center, including completing the work of offering lecture and
course opportunities for students participating in the Cassirer Center.

Inclusive Excellence Incentive (\$3,000):

• **Santiago Gualpuro** (Linguistics and Spanish). Dr. Gualpuro's proposal focuses on creating an inclusive, collaborative, and community-oriented approach to studying, teaching, and researching indigenous languages and cultures in the Americas. This project includes the creation of a new crosslisted course focused on linguistic and cultural studies of the Americas.

Associate Professor Summer Research Incentive (\$5,000):

- Hale Yilmaz (History). Dr. Yilmaz's funds will be used to complete research and writing for a larger project about the historical transformation and contemporary significance of panayirs (fairs) in Turkey, which typically take place after the fall harvests. The funds will allow Dr. Yilmaz to travel to Turkey and finish her research.
- Rachel Whaley (Sociology). Dr. Whaley's proposal focuses on completing
 multiple research projects. One project seeks to better integrate the role of
 gender into the study of criminology. Another project uses national survey
 data to examine patterns in abortion and religion responses post-Dobbs,
 and three related projects will help complete collaborative work with
 current and former graduate students. Dr. Whaley will travel to
 conferences to present this research and work on completing these
 projects.

Assistant-Full Faculty Summer Research Incentive (\$5,000):

- **Ryan Netzley** (English). Dr. Netzley's funds will allow him finish work on a new book project focusing on the role of poems and the poetic form in the larger social order. Dr. Netzley will travel to at least one conference to present the first chapters, and will then work on completing the full manuscript. This will be Dr. Netzley's fourth book.
- Brianna Janssen Sanchez (LCIS). Dr. Janssen Sanchez's project examines
 world language teacher leadership initiatives from a diverse array of
 perspectives. The funds will be used to conduct qualitative interviews with

teachers and administrators to examine their views on these important leadership programs and efforts.

The college applauds the work of the Faculty Development Committee in managing the incentive application process. The CoLA Incentives are open to all faculty in the College of Liberal Arts, and all faculty are encouraged to submit an application for one or more of the incentive categories. The committee reviews and evaluates applications (any committee members who submit applications must recuse themselves from participating in the review and evaluation of all applications in their incentive category). The committee then makes recommendations to the Dean, based on the overall merit of the projects and with consideration for any priorities laid out in each specific incentive description.

2024 CoLA Awards

Tenured/Tenure-Track Outstanding Teacher Award – Scott McEathron, Associate Professor of English. This Award is given to a T/TT faculty member who has established a strong record of teaching excellence through pedagogy, course delivery, and inspirational mentoring of students.

Non-Tenure-Track Outstanding Teacher Award – Christopher Chiasson, Assistant Professor of Practice of German. This Award is given to an NTT faculty who has established a strong record of teaching excellence through pedagogy, course delivery, and inspirational mentoring of students.

Outstanding Graduate Teaching Assistant Award – India Hagen Gates, Graduate Assistant (PhD) in Communication Studies. This award is given to graduate students in the College of Liberal Arts who have demonstrated quality teaching and innovative teaching practices as Teaching Assistants in CoLA courses.
