From the Dean

At the <u>Faculty Senate meeting yesterday</u>, Chancellor Lane both celebrated and thanked all of us for our contributions toward increasing enrollment at SIU. He also took the opportunity to explain how we plan **College Calendars**

to payback the remaining \$12M in debt as prescribed by the FY17-FY24 Sustainability Plan approved by the Board of Trustees.

The bottom line is that SIU intends to zero-out that debt this fiscal year through salary savings (about \$9M) and through non-instructional distance education funds. What this means for CoLA is that we will all need to rely almost entirely on State funds for the rest of this fiscal year (FY24). To be clear, we are in a 10-month "chill" on all spending everything requested will be intensely scrutinized at the Provost level. There is no such thing as "DE money" anymore. Everything is going toward the final debt repayment.

In February, CoLA will present its budget to Provost Tucker for FY25. That means each School will need to present their budgets as we compile our request for the funds we need next year—for hiring, for expenses, for travel, etc. It is not too early for each of you to inform your School leadership about your needs for the next fiscal year. CoLA will need to make a strong, persuasive case for our budgetary needs because there is not a corner of this college that does not require more resources to succeed as SIU grows and endeavors to meet the Imagine 2030 Strategic Plan.

Finally, don't miss the part in Chancellor Lane's presentation that announces a 2% salary increase for everyone at SIU, pending approval by the Board of Trustees. The next 10 months may be difficult, but as SIU comes out of its debt obligation and enrollment continues to grow, we are truly turning a corner and are looking at a brighter future.



Research Brownbag **"Beyond Constitutional Rights: The** Jane Collective and Reproductive Autonomy"

Brittany Leach, an assistant professor of political science and sociology in the School of Anthropology, Political Science, and Sociology, will present "Beyond Constitutional Rights: The Jane Collective and Reproductive Autonomy" from **noon to 1 p.m. Monday, Sept. 18**, at the Museum

Auditorium (Faner 1526). The lecture is free and open to the university community and the public, and those attending are encouraged to bring lunch. There will be time for Q&A after the presentation.

Leach will use the U.S. Supreme Court's June 2022 Dobbs decision and 1992 Casey decision to illustrate competing perspectives. She said the bulk of her talk will focus on the "Jane Collective," an underground Chicago-based organization in the late 1960s and early 1970s that provided abortion services along with counseling prior to the 1973 Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision.

"Their vision of reproductive freedom included more than just a privacy right to have an abortion without government interference," Leach said. "For instance, Jane effectively invented abortion counseling and sought to transform the way that women were treated by medical professionals."

Leach said she will share some archival evidence from her research, which includes quotes from Jane participants. The main argument is that "Jane illustrates the complex and ambiguous relationship between freedom and the law, as well as providing a more nuanced picture of illegal abortions in the pre-Roe era. Learning more about out pre-Roe feminist abortion activism can help shed light on the post-Dobbs situation in states that have banned abortion."
