By fostering these abilities in students Gwen will never meet, the Gwendolyn Conrad Brackett Memorial Scholarship is intended as a living testament to her wise and caring influence in so many lives. In her modesty, Gwen wanted no memorial; we hope she would smile, nevertheless, to learn that new generations of students are being helped to study abroad in her name.

Award Criteria:

- Student must be at least a Junior and either a French major, a LCIS major specializing in French or in International Studies or FLIT with French as their foreign language.
- Student must have an overall GPA of 2.5 with a minimum 3.0. GPA in his or her degree field
- S/he must submit an essay (500 words max.) about how the study abroad experience will benefit his/her future plan

The application deadline is January 31, 2018.

No applications will be accepted past the deadline.
